ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT...

TERI (WINKLER) FOLTZ (Class of '71)



Teri (Winkler) Foltz

After graduating from HHS, Mrs. Foltz earned a degree in English Education from Cumberland College (now University of the Cumberlands) and fell in love with teaching during her student teaching. After a short time teaching in Louisville, she moved back to Northern Kentucky and taught for 7 years at Bellevue High School. It was there where she reconnected with now husband Ken Foltz whom she knew from HHS but never dated. She came back to Highlands in 1989 where she taught for 22 years before retiring. When asked what her favorite thing about teaching at HHS she says, "It always pushed me to be better. Our students are so smart, I felt an obligation to always do better for them."

Her favorite teacher while a student at Highlands was, fittingly, Norman Yonce (English teacher) who helped her fall in love with English. As a student, Teri admired Mr. Yonce so much that she would read whatever he was reading. In a full circle moment, Mrs. Foltz took his job when Mr. Yonce retired.

Foltz's favorite memory as a student at HHS was being a majorette in the marching band. "My brother played football and I marched with the band. Friday nights were so exciting. Every time I see those lights on I think back to how cool Friday nights were."

Foltz retired from teaching in 2011 but has not slowed down one bit. She works as a MAT Supervisor for University of the Cumberlands and is focusing on her passion of writing. She has written two full-length plays, one of which, "The Faculty Lounge", has been produced three times. She also

writes 10-minute "Pint-Sized" plays which have been produced at festivals around the country. You can see her work during Pint Sized Plays at local bars


